



Inclusion Policy

The Values Committee is committed to developing principles ensuring diversity and equity practices at the Toronto School of Art. A mandate of the committee is to design policies that better reflect the demographics of the community it serves and to recommend programs and services that better serve the needs of diverse groups.

Another mandate is to increase access to and opportunities at the Toronto School of Art for those belonging to groups historically excluded from power or denied rights enjoyed by others. Among those who face such discrimination are members of ethnic, racial, linguistic and religious minorities, Aboriginal people, people with disabilities, women, gay, lesbian, bisexual and transgender, seniors and, in some cases, youth, and people marginalized by poverty.

TSA operates on the second floor of the former Kent Senior School – a century-old Toronto District School Board building without an elevator. TSA regrets this barrier to access; this goes against our values of inclusion. TSA and the Values Committee are planning access for all in the future.
