TSA UPDATE: IMPROVING ACCESS IN THE ARTS

Toronto School of Art (TSA) is pleased to announce a generous investment from **Ontario Trillium Foundation (OTF)**, supporting the accessibility plan for TSA's future home on 24 Ryerson Avenue, a four-storey building in the Queen and Bathurst area.

TSA has been awarded a \$150,000 OTF Capital Grant for the installation of an elevator to ensure all can physically access TSA studios and the opportunity to receive high-quality visual arts education.

OTF Capital Grants provide funding to improve infrastructure required for communities to thrive. This significant investment helps TSA broaden access to year-round courses and services available to the general public, and better reflects the [TSA Mandate](#) and [Inclusion Policy](#).

About TSA's future home

Built in the early 1900's, this historic factory building has always been an industrious site of creativity and community, including studio spaces for many prominent artists, writers, poets, designers, and an art gallery co-op in the 1970-80's.

TSA is thrilled to re-purpose the building as a barrier-free venue for arts education and contribute to the vibrant Queen West area while recognizing its rich history in the arts. Along with general interior renovations, the building will have physical accessibility features including: an entrance ramp, automatic doors at the entrance, accessible washrooms, and accessible parking.

TSA looks forward to launching our Winter 2019 programming from our new location. Stay tuned for more updates!

Every picture tells a story and none more so than this image of me taken on the Nahanni River in the North West Territory this summer. Garbed in a dry suit to prevent being tossed into the glacier fed river, a mandatory floatation device so that my frozen body would be retrievable should the aforementioned catastrophe occur, and two waterproof bags containing the cameras that I used to record the making of a feature documentary film, *Nahanni River of Forgiveness*. The unfortunate beard is the result of living conditions on the river where bathing and shaving were on hold for thirty days plus some. On that no more need be said.

The feature documentary produced by 90th Parallel Productions of Toronto for the CBC, NHK Japan among others records the building of a 40 foot moose skin boat at the headwaters of the Nahanni and the process of navigating the boat thru 400 km of rapids, canyons and

waterfalls along one of the wildest wilderness rivers on the planet. The voyage had not been attempted for more than 100 years and was inspired by the desire of the Dehcho Dene of the region to build pride in the accomplishments of their culture. It was an honour to be part of this extraordinary endeavour.
